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Transition Power Development Signs Lease for 30,000 Acre Feet of Water with San Juan County

SALT LAKE CITY, UT – TPD signed another lease for water. This time it was with San Juan County Water Conservancy District. Water is an essential part of developing a new nuclear power plant. Water is used for making and cooling steam in the thermal process of generating electricity. “Whenever we talk to someone about our project in the industry the first thing they ask is “Do you have the water?” Without water you really do not have a project. Signing this lease has allowed us to double the size of our Blue Castle project.” said Aaron Tilton CEO of TPD.

This water right has been unused for well over forty years. It is part of Utah’s Flaming Gorge allocation in the Upper Colorado basin from the early 1960’s.

A change application will be submitted some time in the future to approve a new place of diversion near the proposed power plant site.
